This is an historic peat bog and rare wildlife habitat on the southern edge of Macclesfield which holds massive amounts of carbon in its soil. Cheshire East council are planning a huge housing and retail development on 136 acres of the Moss., The willow tit is just one

of the endangered

species whose habitat would be destroyed. I was asked to make this rather large willow tit to collect donations (see the slot in her back!) to help fund the legal campaign against the plans. I'm also working with them to create an even larger willow tit for the Barnaby Festival. Look out for her in the Parade on 16 June!
